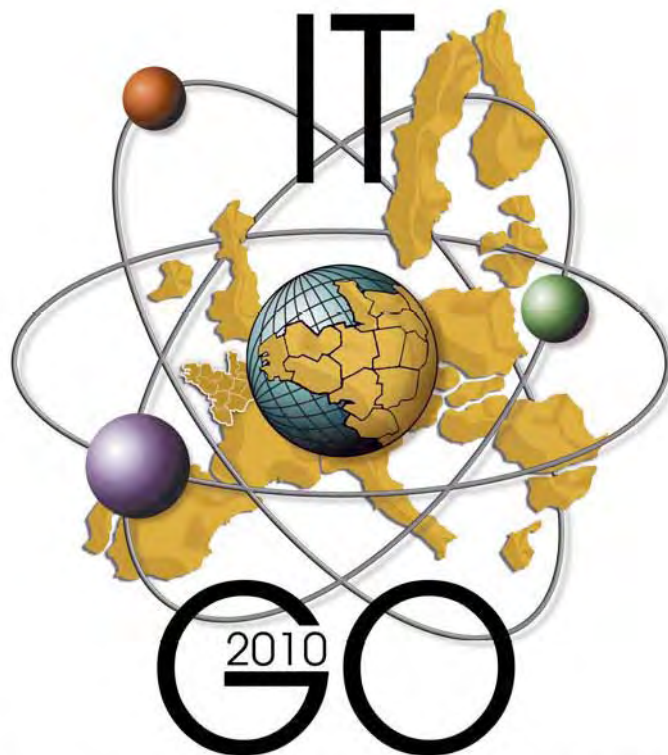

“Territoriale intelligence and socio-ecological foresight”

In continuity of the caENTI « coordination action European Network of Territorial Intelligence » (March, 2006 - February, 2009), the board of ENTI have defined since the beginning of September, 2009, a research programmes with three axes and three transversal topics.

The three axis are:

- [territories] Territories as the place and territorial intelligence as the mean of a socio-ecological transition characterized by the combination of economic, social, environmental and cultural objectives of sustainable development.
- [indicators] The definition of sustainable development indicators according to the plurality of its objectives, the accessibility of these indicators for all the territorial actors of the territories, scientific methods of multi-criteria analysis and of spatial analysis, and tools of analysis of the indicators for, with and by the actors.
- [governance] Territorial governance favouring sustainable development

The three transversal topics are:

- [vulnerability] Vulnerability of territories and vulnerable populations
- [culture] The culture as fourth objective of the sustainable development of territories
- [gender] Gender equality and sustainable development of territories

These themes and these themes have been defined, first, based on anticipated needs of the project «Future jobs, better life» (job-LIFE) under the 7th research program of the European Union and of secondly, as a reference for a proposed International Group Research Territorial Intelligence (GdRIit).

Job-LIFE was filed February 2 and we are building the GdRIit for late April.

ENTI, European Network of Territorial Intelligence «, is a virtual laboratory open to anyone wishing to contribute to its research program. It manages the dissemination tools such as this conference, or portal <http://www.territorial-intelligence.eu> Partners involvement in the tasks are to be defined.

The objective of jobs-LIFE is to establish a prospective for jobs in Europe at a territorial level in 2025, within the framework of the socio-ecological transition, with new development trajectories characterized by the combination of the sustainable development objectives for a better life quality. job-LIFE, is a “large-scale integrating project” in the topic “Creating and adapting jobs in Europe in the context of a socio-ecological transition”. It gathers a consortium of 39 participants, managed by the CNRS (France,) during 4 years and with a budget of 10 M€(8M€grants). It is a virtual laboratory of 23 research centres and 13 territorial actors that will contribute to the dissemination of research results and innovative practices. 36 participants, from 11 European countries, will cooperate with 3 non European research teams. The project organizes nine work packages into three research axis. Each work package organizes at least three main tasks. The functions of the participants, who have been defined mainly in terms of work packages should be detailed to the task level.

The objective of GdRIit is to integrate at worldwide level research-action teams in territorial intelligence to create a virtual laboratory linking of territorial research-action centers involving multidisciplinary and associating multi-sector development partnerships, around a program of collaborative international research on the topic of the observation of territories.

The day of 23 March, 2010, will be devoted to enhancing the ENTI research project, the job-LIFE work plan and the GdRIit activities based on the research program ENTI.

TERRITORIAL INTELLIGENCE AND SOCIO ECOLOGICAL FORESIGHT

State of art for territorial intelligence, axes of research of the ENTI network and of the european project answering the call of the 7th Framework Programme for Research, the large scale integrating project Job-LIFE and international prospects.

Speakers :

JEAN JACQUES GIRARDOT: PhD in economics, associate professor at the University of Franche-Comte, is the scientific coordinator of the European Network of Territorial Intelligence ENTI, action of the “Maison des Sciences de l’Homme et de l’Environnement” Claude Nicolas LEDOUX (MSHE, CNRS USR 3214). Designer of the data analysis software ANACONDA (1981, Apple Research award) and PRAGMA (1991), of the method of sustainable development project and of territorial observation CATALYSE (1990) and of territorial intelligence (1998), he is the head of territorial intelligence research team within the «Theorizing and modelling for territorial planning» (UMR CNRS 6049), TheMA, research unit. After coordinating the FP6 European coordination action caENTI from March 2006 to February 2009, he coordinates the FP7 European large-scale integrating project job-LIFE «Future jobs, better life: creating and adapting jobs in Europe in the context of a socio-ecological transition « and a project of International Research Group in territorial intelligence.

GUÉNAËL DEVILLET: PhD in Geography, associate professor at the University of Liege is head of the SEGEFA (Surveys centre in economic geography) which deals with research questions of basic or applied economic geography and more specific sustainable development of territories in which the territorial indicators since their creations to their representations. Member of the ENTI board and of its scientific committee, he has coordinated research activities on territorial indicators in FP6 European coordination action caENTI. He now coordinates the ENTI research axis on territorial indicators and the axis «Work, territories and life quality in the combination of the objectives of the sustainable development” within FP7 job-LIFE European integrating project.

PHILIPPE WOLOSZYN: CNRS research worker in “Space and Society” ESO laboratory UMR 6590. After his architecture and acoustical engineering diplomas, he gets his degree from University of Nantes, with using specific fractal measurements of architectural geometry, coupled with virtual sound restitution. His recent projects develop a synergy between architects, physicians and psychologists in order to model environmental effects of urban ambient surroundings on people, inhabitants and users. He has been expert for the ‘Transport Energetical and Environmental Assessment’ operational research group of the PREDIT (Interministry Terrestrial Transport National Innovation and Research Program), the CSEA (Architectural Teaching Overhead Council), and the CoNRS (Research National Committee). In 2003, the French National Research Centre (CNRS) awarded him the bronze medal for his interdisciplinary contribution to the Architectural and Urban Research Field. Member of the ENTI board and of its scientific committee, he has coordinated research activities on territorial indicators within caENTI, he animates the task «Combining economic, social, cultural and environmental dimensions of sustainable development objectives » within in FP7 job-LIFE European integrating project.

BLANCA MIÉDES UGARTE : PhD in Economics, associate professor of labour economics and active employment policies within the Labour Science Faculty, she is head of the Observatory of Local Employment (OLE) at the University of Huelva. Dean of European convergence, member of the ENTI board and of its scientific committee, she has coordinated research activities on governance principles in FP6 European coordination action caENTI. She now coordinates the ENTI research axis on territorial indicators and the axis « Territorial job systems, innovation and governance for creating and adapting jobs in the socio-ecological transition” within FP7 job-LIFE European integrating project.

CYRIL MASSELOT : PhD in Information and Communication Science, associate professor in the University of Franche-Comte, researcher at the Laboratory of Semiotics, Linguistics, Teaching and Computers, he is responsible for the technological platform of the Maison des Sciences de l’Homme et de l’Environnement Claude Nicolas LEDOUX. Member of the ENTI board and of its scientific committee, he has coordinated research activities the development of CATALYSE tools and dissemination in FP6 European coordination action caENTI. He now coordinates the ENTI research axis on territorial indicators and the axis “Communication, culture, education and dissemination for new development trajectories” within FP7 job-LIFE European integrating project.

This tool is a model for the evaluation of the quality of the participative processes within the framework of projects of research-action.

The quality letter of the research-action facilitating the territorial governance of the sustainable development drafted by Workpackage 5 of the caENTI and presented during the second international annual conference of territorial intelligence which took place in Huelva (in October 24-27th, 2007) suggested that the key factor for the evaluation of the quality of a process of research-action is the quality of the participative process between the researchers and the actors.

It is methods of statistical and spatial analysis of the data, protocols of project management and the evaluation, the knowledge bases, the systems of scientific and technical publishing, geographical information systems, that use the information and communication technologies. The harmonization of the European observatories Catalyses is made within the framework of the caENTI.
